



DECEMBER BUGEL CALL 2020

Dear Siblings, sisters, and brothers in Christ. Grace and Peace to you from God the Father; From our Lord and Savior Jesus the Christ; In, with, and through the Holy Spirit. AMEN!!

This Sunday (November 29) begins the Advent season, which is the beginning of the church year. By the time you all receive this newsletter, we will be well on our way into Advent 2020, and if this past year has taught us anything, it is to expect the unexpected. The year 2020 has been a year of challenge and change, and indeed grief and lament. We have not had regular in-person-with-one-another worship since March; we have been told that traveling and meeting as large groups is not a healthy idea, and as a result maybe our long-time Thanksgiving Day family traditions have not come to pass. As it stands right now we are not going to have in-person-in-the-sanctuary Christmas Eve/Day worship services. The COVID-19 pandemic has made a royal mess of things this year, and for many families has resulted in tragic, un-timely deaths of loved ones and dear friends. It is indeed a time of lament and uncertainty. Even in this Advent season, the beginning of the church year when we look forward to Christ's coming (and coming again) and await this joyous reality with eager expectation, we are humbled and saddened by the reality of all that we have lost this past pandemic year. We have had enough; we are COVID fatigued, we long for Good News, we yearn for hope.

These current experiences of God's people have happened to God's people throughout history. The Hebrew Bible (Old Testament) reading for the first Sunday in Advent is Isaiah 64:1-9, which begins (in the lament of the post-Babylonian Exile Hebrew people who have lost everything, and are returned [returning] to a place that they do not recognize) with a plea to the God of the Israelites, "O that you would tear open the heavens and come down, so that the mountains would quake at your presence—". I really feel like that. Perhaps you do too. I would like nothing more than Christ to come again RIGHT NOW and make everything all better: to rescue us from this pestilence; to heal our differences and unite us from our divisive nature; to show us that God's Love reigns supreme; and (in the words of Vicar Stephen's wife, Vicar Leah, in a recent sermon to the congregation she serves) 'To expect Christ to show up.'

I need that hope, and I believe I am correct in saying that all of us need that hope, that promise, that eternal TRUTH that Christ can and does show up, even in the midst of tragedy and grief and lament, with great and abiding and unconditional and unimaginable love for us all, for YOU! We need that reassurance, which is written over and over again in Holy Scripture for us all to read, and bask in, and delight in, and take exceeding comfort in. To trust that we are forever and for all time wrapped in God's Love for us all, for YOU!

Also in that 64th chapter of Isaiah, as a portion of the reading for the first Sunday in Advent, we are gifted and blessed with the prophet Isaiah's words in verse 4; "From ages past no one has heard, no ear has perceived, no eye has seen any God besides you, who works for those who wait for Him." You have heard these words before in scripture, but perhaps not quite in that context. We read in the Apostle Paul's First Letter to the Church at Corinth, the second chapter, the ninth verse, "... what no eye has seen, nor ear heard, nor the human heart conceived, what God has prepared for those who love Him."

Now in the academic sense, there is no real agreement amongst Biblical scholars that these two verses are based one upon the other (although in my little pea-brain they certainly are!) the clearer-in-my-sight words of the Apostle Paul (citing written scripture) bring such peace and hope and promise to my affect, especially in these broken-world, divided-world, COVID-world times. Perhaps they do for you too. My prayer is that those words seize your heart and fill you with the Peace that only God can bring.

In this Advent time, when we observe Christ's coming into the world, and we lean into and look forward with eager expectation to Christ's coming again, the words of the prophet Isaiah and the Apostle Paul remind us and compel us into a reordered thinking about what it is that is important in the lives that we have been given by God. Living with purpose and great intentionality to love the Lord our God with all of our hearts, all of our souls, all of our mind, and all of our strength, and to love our neighbors as ourselves. It is that simple, and it is that complicated. God is good, all of the time. And all of the time, God is good.

Vicar's Voice – Vicar Stephen Nilsen

“Comfort, O comfort my people says your God. Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her that she has served her term, that her penalty is paid, that she has received from the Lord’s hand double for all her sins. A voice cries out: *“In the wilderness prepare the way of the Lord, make straight in the desert a highway for our God. Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain. Then the glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together, for the mouth of the Lord has spoken.”* – **Isaiah 40:1-5**

As we prepare the way of the Lord in our church calendar with this Advent season, I am struck by these few verses coming up in our lectionary from Advent Week 2 (December 6th this year). All of creation has been in upheaval this year: from the pandemic that has affected all of humanity to storms that have ravaged places like Iowa and Illinois and hurricanes in the south, it feels like more than any other year the entire creation is crying out for mercy, crying out for hope, and crying out for justice.

What have you cried out to your Lord for in this tumultuous time?

“The grass withers, the flower fades, but the word of our God will stand forever.” – **Isaiah 40:8**

I look outside at the garden behind the parsonage, tended by faithful stewards, and the fields across the highway, now harvested and fading away after another year. Another cycle of life has come and gone for those plants, and still the word of our God will stand forever. When we think about seasons in our lives, what remains constant? No matter how worship has been done: whether chanting in the time of Martin Luther or singing contemporary songs on the third Sunday in Loganville, Wisconsin, the word of the Lord stands (or remains, or endures) *forever!* This can remind us in this time of Advent waiting that there is one thing that is unchanging: the faithfulness of God to God’s Word. It is at the very heart of what we believe as Christians and especially as Lutherans.

Why “especially as Lutherans?” Well, in the time of the Reformation, followers of Martin Luther’s reformation would find that in spite of all attempts to place conditions upon God’s Word of law and gospel (or cover it over with human traditions), that God’s Word remains true. A Latin slogan *Verbum Domini Manet in Aeternum* (the Word of God endures forever) took on special significance in the reformation. Followers like



Fredrick the Wise sewed the slogan onto court liveries, armor, flags, canons, and all manner of objects. The slogan was shortened to its first letters, and placed around a cross, and some would even show it to others they came across on the way – sort of like a Reformation-era Christ-fish symbol in the sand – even by some in the form of a tattoo. I live with a constant reminder of this, as my wife, Vicar Leah has a tattoo of the VDMA symbol on her wrist; it sometimes shows when she holds her arms up to proclaim forgiveness at the beginning of worship services, and how fitting! Above all other issues of our broken world, with its sins and its withering, the Word of God Endures Forever!

In John’s Gospel, we begin with the familiar “In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was God...” passage. That Word has endured since creation and will endure long after any of us or our crops or the cows or deer are here. In this stressful time of worry and wondering what will be of our Christmas holiday, I am given comfort (as this article started) by knowing of that enduring Word of God.

In the name of God whose word endures forever, *Vicar Stephen Nilsen*

December Message from Vicky.....

I am going to talk about change in this message. The year 2020 has brought more changes than I can count. The world continues to be faced with change. The news tells us we are still not THERE yet. Where is THERE? That is the million dollar question, to me. The future in the past had constants so, it was maybe clearer where THERE was. WE understand that you have questions and so as we move into a NEW church year. Here is what the Council talks about....

First, is our conversation of in person worship and other activities. The Council has voted to remain virtual ONLY at least until January 3, 2021. We will be discussing the status of worship and all other activities inside the church walls on a monthly basis. The recommendation to keep our gatherings small (under 10 / or in the case of the holidays within households) is where we stand at this time. The virtual worship is likely to remain a constant even when we get THERE. It is our request from each of you to let your Church know if you need assistance in participating during virtual worship.

One option to make the internet user friendly is to offer workshops during the month of December. A little tutoring can't hurt. Conversations with Pastor Don and Vicar Stephen, held weekly on Zoom, is a great time to get your questions answered too. We are very blessed to have Vicar Stephen to help all of us through this tech world we live in.

Second item, that was spoken in great detail, is the Annual Meeting in January. According to the Constitution, we have 30 days to hold our meeting following the end of the calendar year. And normally, it has been scheduled for the fourth Sunday in January. We are going to use every day allowed and so the date for the ANNUAL MEETING is SATURDAY, JANUARY 30, 2021 at 2:00PM.
