

## PASTOR DON'S May 2022 BUGLE CALL

Dear Siblings, Sisters, and Brothers in Christ! Grace and Peace to you from God the Father; From our Lord and Savior Jesus the Christ; In, with, and through the Holy Spirit. AMEN!

Where do you go, what do you do, and when do you seek the comfort and presence of God? I have not made this a big secret as to what I do when I seek God's abiding and awesome presence; I go fishing. That's right, I am an angling pescatore! And most often, even if I travel with a super-trusted colleague, or a family member to Stream X, we do our fishing separately, experiencing the sedate and yet exhilarating experience of 'standing-in-a-crick-waving-a stick' in search of *Salmo trutta*, *Oncorhynchus mykiss*, *Salvelinus fontinalis* (aka brown, rainbow, and brook trout {well, the brook trout is not really a trout, but rather more of a char}) or having the irksome tension of a snag on a pesky root ball or tree branch and having to break off the size 16 Pink Squirrel or Winscher's Wonder instead of delightfully releasing the fair-caught aquatic creature back into God's good creation! (Wow, talk about a run-on sentence, ten lines! My high school English teacher would say I have not changed a bit!)

Perhaps you recall some of what happened during the Lenten worship services, where we prefaced worship with a rendition of what happened to the prophet Elijah after God persevered through him over the priests of Baal: After fleeing for his life, he was told by the Word of the Lord to ascend the mountain, where God was about to pass by. Elijah did so. And there was a great wind that split boulders into pieces, but the Lord was not in the wind. And after the wind an earthquake, but the Lord was not in the earthquake. And after the earthquake a fire, but the Lord was not in the fire. And after the fire, a sound of sheer silence. And after the silence the voice of the Lord came to Elijah, with instructions, with Torah, for his journey.

Sometimes we need to get out of our own way and seek the silence that is God, and yearn for the instruction, the Torah, of God's Holy Spirit.

In these times we are in, you may be experiencing a dearth of guidance, or words of support, or comfort, when we feel (incorrectly) that God is not present. In that regard, I invite you to consider these words of the prophet Jeremiah, the 29<sup>th</sup> chapter: "For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope. Then when you call upon me and come and pray to me, I will hear you. When you search for me, you will find me; if you seek me with all your heart, I will let you find me, says the Lord, and I will restore your fortunes and gather you from all the nations and all the places where I have driven you..."





## *A Message from Vicar Nathaniel*

“Priorities”

When I was a teacher, a lot of emphasis was placed on student growth and performance. A lot of time was spent monitoring how well each student met the rigors of the prescribed curriculum, and how they interacted with teachers, school staff, and each other. Multiple times a year, special focus was given on how well students performed on the several standardized tests that they were required to complete each year.

Early in my teaching career, I stumbled upon a piece of advice that became a guiding principle of my time in the classroom: students who feel safe at school, who believe that they are genuinely cared for and are a part of a community, will almost invariably show growth and progress. In other words, if everyone at school focuses on the big picture – helping each young person become the best possible version of themselves – then the important detail of *is everyone learning what they're supposed to be learning* will follow quite naturally.

Over the course of my adult life, I have heard many people talk about the future of the Christian church. Since starting seminary, I have often heard statistics documenting the slow, steady erosion of attendance at Lutheran congregations in the United States (which matches trends in mainline Protestantism and Roman Catholicism). More than once, I have heard the calculation that, if current rates of decline in church participation continue, the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America will have a *negative number of members* by sometime in the middle of the twenty-first century. It's technically impossible, obviously, but it does get its point across.

The question of vitality in the wider Church is no stranger to the St. Peter's community. When we look at old photos of packed worships, faith education classrooms, and fellowship and outreach activities, it's only natural to feel nostalgic. It's only natural to look at the past and think, *What can we do to get back there?*

I don't have any magic solution, but my gut (or maybe the Holy Spirit) tells me that the future of St. Peter's and the Lutheran Church – of Christianity in general – hinges on what effective teachers know: always remember the big picture.

If the goal of the Church (our church, or any church) is to fill pews on Sundays, keep the building shipshape, and meet budgetary stewardship goals, then the Church is (and probably should be) doomed.

If the Church's goal is to proclaim the Good News of Jesus and reach out in love, to everyone but especially to those forgotten or rejected by society, then the Church will endure and thrive.

The Church of the future may not look like the Church of twenty or forty years ago. Living through a period of change is often scary. But God is with us in this time and in this place, and the Holy Spirit is moving through us, guiding us forward, into whatever comes next.
